PURPOSE OF PROGRAM

The purpose of The American Legion Baseball program is to develop Americanism and Citizenship. Therefore, American Legion Baseball players will not be allowed to smoke while in uniform. Smoking, profanity, or the use of intoxicating liquors will not be permitted in the dugouts or on the playing field at any time. Anyone found doing so may be removed from further participation. It also recommends that no form of any tobacco be permitted inside the ballpark as well as the playing field and dugout. Enforcement of this rule is mandatory.

The ND High School Activities Association Board of Directors, along with the ND High School Coaches Association, asked the Department Athletic Committee to cooperate with them in their efforts to curb the use of tobacco, alcohol, and controlled substances. This means uniform enforcement through local sponsors and management both on and off the field for all participants. We ask your cooperation.

CODE OF SPORTSMANSHIP

The Code of Sportsmanship, as printed in the National Rule Book, will be recited prior to all tournament games. Therefore, all teams are encouraged to institute reciting the Code prior to games during regular season.

See the National 2007 Rulebook for American Legion Baseball to familiarize you with the rule changes effective for the 2007 American Legion Baseball Season.

PLAYING REGULATIONS - RULE 1

The Official Baseball Rules and National Rules shall govern all games, except as follows:

- D. Coaching Lines** - Any adult coach or player making any remarks or undue criticism of opposing players will be ejected immediately from the game, in accordance with National Rule 7 on conduct.
- F. Designated Hitter Rule** – A designated hitter may be used in all Class A and B Regular and Post Season games in accordance with the Major League Baseball American League Designated Hitter Rule, which allows a DH for the pitcher, only.
- K. Insurance** - ALL TEAMS MUST BE COVERED BY S.A. VAN DYK INC. ACCIDENT-MEDICAL AND LIABILITY INSURANCE FOR THE ENTIRE SEASON! Proof must be submitted with Form 1 by June 25th to appropriate Department Athletic Committee Member.
- N. Innings Pitched.**
- 4. Innings of Season Games** - All season games may be either nine or seven innings, except double-headers which will be seven innings.
- R. Substitution** – **The re-entry rule has been repealed and the following conditions took effect for the 2006 season.** There will be no re-entry rule in effect for all Class A Regular and Post Season games and all Class B Post season games. Class B Sections may, at their pre-season Sectional Meetings, establish a policy for their regular season games that will allow a coach to pull any of his starters, in favor of a substitution, and then return the starter to the game once. When returned the starter must replace the substitute in the same spot in the batting order that he held when taken from the game. The second time a starter is taken from the contest, regular rules apply, and he may not be reinserted into the lineup.
- THERE WILL BE NO COURTESY RUNNERS ALLOWED IN ALL REGULAR SEASON AND POST SEASON GAMES IN EITHER CLASS A OR CLASS B DIVISIONS.**
- S. Regulations Outfield Fence** - All teams playing in the program must provide a regulation outfield fence. Regional Supervisor has guidelines.

PLAYER'S ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS - RULE 2

- A. Date of Birth** - Players on Class A or Class B North Dakota Legion Baseball teams must have been born on or after January 1, 1988. Class A cities can enter or field a "B" team for Class B section tournaments, providing all players are born on or after January 1, 1990.
- B. Player Residence** - If a player's legal residence is established prior to March 31 of this year in a community other than the community where he attends high school, he may play either team. His election must be in writing and filed with Department Athletic Committee Chairman Ken Vatne, 20 Hamlet Ave., Hamlet, ND 58795-9400, by June 30, 2007.

4. Eligibility situations not covered under National Rules.

c. College and university students, and other players not in high school, must play with the American Legion Baseball team for which they last played while in high school. For the purposes of determining eligibility, the enrollment of their previous high schools will be counted.

d. When a player and his parents move into a community after March 31, the player is immediately eligible to play American Legion Baseball with the team in that community if he notifies Dept. Athletic Committee Chairman Ken Vatne, 20 Hamlet Ave. Hamlet, ND 58795-9400, by June 30 and is granted approval.

E. Order Needed Birth Certificates Early.

4. Birth certificates of players born in North Dakota should be secured as soon as possible from the Vital Records Program, State Department of Health, State Capitol, Judicial Wing, Bismarck, ND 58505. The fee is \$7 for each certified copy of birth certificate issued...and fee must accompany request for certificate(s). Use special form, which will be sent, automatically with your Team Entry Form after you submit Team Entry Fee to Department Headquarters. NOTE: Class B teams are allowed to submit photocopies of birth certificates and or hospital records.

- F. Playing on Other Teams** - A player will play with his Legion Baseball team on game dates and practice sessions. Upon approval of Legion team manager, player may play with amateur baseball team. Legion pitchers may not pitch for amateur team if his Legion team has a game within 48 hours before or after amateur team game date. Upon approval of Legion team manager, player may play with local softball team. It is important that such dual participation will not, in any way, interfere with a player's responsibility to American Legion Baseball.

- G. Players in active military service** are not eligible to play American Legion Baseball in North Dakota.

PLAYER RECRUITING - PLAN A - RULE 3

The Official American Legion Baseball Rules PLAN "B" of the National Americanism Commission will govern all American Legion Baseball competition in North Dakota.

PLAYER RECRUITING - PLAN B - RULE 4

B. Team selection of players based on school enrollment

6. A player enrolled in high school in a state other than his legal residence, must play with the team of his legal residence. If no team is available, he must play with the school he attends.

7. If no program is available in his community and a player is in school, he must play with the team recruited from the school he attends. If no team is recruited from his school or in the community of his legal residence, established prior to March 31 of this year, he must play for the team nearest his legal residence provided he is eligible to compete with this team and his election must be in writing and filed with and approved by Ken Vatne, 20 Hamlet Ave., Hamlet, ND 58795-9400, by June 30, 2007. **In cases involving the crossing of state lines, mutual written permission of both Department Chairmen is necessary.**

SPECIAL RULES - PLAN B ONLY

Department closing date as referenced to in the National Rule Book under Rule 4 is hereby established as June 30, 2007.

PROTESTS - RULE 5

A. **The Department Athletic Committee** will handle all formal protests of rules other than those made during a game, which will be handled by the chief umpire. All decisions of the Committee are final.

1. **Filing Deadlines** - Protests of rules, other than those made during a game, can be made anytime during the season but must be submitted to the Department Athletic Committee Chairman, Ken Vatne, 20 Hamlet Ave., Hamlet, ND 58795-9400, within 15 days of knowledge of a violation or dispute. (See Rule 9.D for specific deadline for protest involving player eligibility.)
2. **Filing Fee** - Due to the increase in time and expenses related to handling a protest, a \$25 deposit must accompany protest filed with the Department Athletic Committee. The protesting post must pay any court costs that may be incurred as a result of a protest.
3. **Processing Time** - The Department Athletic Committee will make every effort to resolve properly filed protests within 5 workdays.
4. **Investigation** - Any coach or manager who, in any way, interferes with the investigation of the eligibility of players will be suspended from the Legion Baseball program for one year.

TEAM AND PLAYER CERTIFICATION - RULE 6

A. Team Registration - All posts or other organizations sponsoring teams must fill out the Team Entry Form and send it to American Legion State Headquarters, Box 2666, Fargo, ND 58108, as soon as possible but not later than April 15, 2007, with Team Entry Fee. The Team Entry Fee \$60 MUST accompany Team Entry Form before Form 1 will be mailed from Department Headquarters.

1. Form 1 - Upon receipt of National Form 1 from State Headquarters, team sponsor must complete Form 1 in original and four photocopies. Form 1 should be typed and players listed alphabetical.

2. Filing deadline for Form 1 is prior to June 25, 2007.

a. Class B Teams - Send completed Form 1 plus **FOUR** photocopies of Form 1, listing up to maximum of 18 players, to the Athletic Officer in Charge of your Region by June 25, 2007.

b. Class A Eastern and Western Division teams must send completed Form 1 plus four photocopies of Form 1, listing a maximum of 18 players, to Ken Vatne, 20 Hamlet Ave. Hamlet, ND 58795-9400 (Phone W-539-2165, H-539-2366), prior to June 25, 2007.

c. Errors - The Department Athletic Officer in charge of your Section/Division will notify all teams whose forms are incomplete on July 5, 2007, so they can correct errors by midnight, July 10, 2007.

d. Incomplete Form 1 Disqualifies Team - Any team whose forms are not complete by midnight, July 10, 2007, will not be allowed to compete in the tournaments according to State Rules.

3. Insurance - National Rule requires that Proof of Group Accident and Liability Insurance Coverage for the entire season must accompany completed National Form 1. All team coverage must be through the recommended carrier, which is S.A. Van Dyk, Inc., PO Box 4806, Oak Brook, Illinois 60522-4806. All certificates issued by S.A. Van Dyk Insurance Administrators will automatically include a duplicate copy, which the team should attach to completed National Form 1 when submitted to the Department Athletic Officer in charge of your Region.

RULE 6 - Continued

- 4. Birth Certificates** - All Class A and B teams must file one copy of birth certificate for each player along with completed Form 1, plus four photocopies, by June 25. **CLASS A ONLY:** Failure to file certified copy of birth certificate requires disqualification of players concerned. **BAPTISMAL OR HOSPITAL RECORDS CANNOT BE USED IN LIEU OF CERTIFIED COPY OF BIRTH CERTIFICATE!** Natl Rule 2E will be complied with at all levels of competition. Record of birth **MUST** be an original or state certified copy.
- 5. Team Photograph** - All Class A and Class B Teams must file 4 copies (5" x 7") of Team photograph at the time they submit their completed Form 1. Each copy of the team photograph **MUST** include the identification of personnel shown on the picture.
- D. Dual Registration** - Up to three (3) players listed on a Class A team roster may be eligible to play on their "B" squads or second teams in Class B leagues, conference, or tournament play providing that they meet all eligibility requirements for Class B play and they are duly rostered on that teams "B" roster by the official roster deadline.
- F. Sponsorship** - Outside companies, groups, or clubs may sponsor a team or league in The American Legion Baseball program. However, the Department of North Dakota requires that a Legionnaire be officially in charge of the team as manager!
- G. Class B Teams** - All Post American Legion Baseball teams except Bismarck, Devils Lake, Dickinson, Fargo, Grand Forks, Jamestown, Mandan, Minot, Valley City, Wahpeton, West Fargo, and Williston will play in Class B competition.
- H. Class A Teams** will be split into two divisions and must play home and home doubleheaders with each team in their division. Rainouts do not need to be made up unless they affect the standings. The game will be forfeited if not willing to make up.
- 1. Class A Eastern Division** teams include, Fargo, Grand Forks, Jamestown, Valley City, West Fargo and Wahpeton.
 - 2. Class A Western Division** teams include Bismarck, Devils Lake, Dickinson, Mandan, Minot and Williston.
- I. Second Team** - Class A cities can enter or field a "B" team for Class B section tournaments, providing all team players are born on or after January 1, 1990, and team entry fee for that team has been paid. All other requirements are the same.

CONDUCT - RULE 7

- D. During a Department Tournament** - Any player, coach or manager suspended from a game by an umpire for unsportsmanlike conduct will be suspended for a period determined by the umpire and the Department Athletic Committee Representative, their decision is final.

RULE 7 - Continued

- F. Post Responsible for Players Conduct** - All posts will be held responsible for the conduct of their players during the baseball season and during tournament play. It is strongly urged that the Team Manager or another adult be in the dugout at all times.

DEPARTMENT JURISDICTION - RULE 8

- A. Department Rules** - The Department Athletic Committee is responsible for formulating Department Rules. All corrections and recommended changes must be submitted to the Committee Chairman prior to Sept 30 each year.
- D. Appointments and Supervision** - The Department Athletic Officer is in charge of his Section or will appoint a qualified assistant to help supervise The American Legion Baseball program.
- E. Umpire-in-Chief** – The Department Commander shall appoint one or more Umpire-in-Chief to be confirmed by Department Executive Committee. The Umpire-in-Chief will:
1. Assist the Department Athletic Committee on:
 - a. Setting up rules clinics and umpire workshops
 - b. Selecting umpires for sectional and state tournaments
 - c. Interpreting rules situations
 2. Perform whatever duties the Committee Chairman may designate.
- F. Team Commitment** - The signing of Form 1 by players, coaches, and team managers is a commitment to play Legion Baseball without interference from any other organized sport and is a guarantee that they will participate in tournament play as long as they are qualified. Pulling out of tournament schedules without a release from the Department Athletic Committee shall be subject to a \$200 fine--payable to the host post of tournament site--and suspension or probation from Legion Baseball for one year. This applies to the coach as well as the team...regarding suspension and probation.

DEPARTMENT TOURNAMENTS - RULE 9

- A. Class A and Class B State Champions** will be determined in separate State Tournaments. The team winning the Class A tournament will be certified by the Department Athletic Committee Chairman to National and advance to the Central Plains Regional Tournament. Any Class B team wishing to participate in the Class A Tournaments for the opportunity to advance to National competition must attend the Class A scheduling meeting which is held in Mandan on the second Sunday of January each year.
1. **Athletic Officers Expenses for Tournament** - The expense of the Department representative at the Sectional, Divisional, and State Tournaments will be paid by the appropriate Section, Division, and State Tournament Managers upon presentation of statement of expenses connected with such tournament. **THIS IS AN OBLIGATION OF THE POST HOSTING TOURNAMENTS.**

RULE 9 - Continued

2. **Double-elimination format** will be used in all Sectional, Divisional and State Tournaments.
 3. **Rain Delay** - If a tournament game is halted by rain, it will be continued from point of interruption, regardless of inning, unless time is a factor in completing tournament. In that case, five innings (Class A and Class B) would constitute a completed game.
 4. **Ten Run Rule** - All games will be considered a completed contest if one team is leading by ten or more runs at the end of five-innings for Class B and by 10 runs or more at the end of seven-innings for Class A or any completed inning thereafter. This rule applies to all tournament games.
 5. **All Class B Tournament** play will be 7 innings. All Class A Tournament play will be 9 innings.
 6. **Ceremonies** – Tournament officials will make certain that The National Anthem will be played at least once daily at all Sectional, Divisional and State Tournaments and that The American Legion Baseball Code of Conduct will be recited by all players and coaches prior to every game at Sectional, Divisional and State Tournaments.
- B. Competition in State Tournaments** (Class A and B) is open only to teams that have been properly registered prior to the June 25, 2007, filing deadline in accordance with Dept Rule 6.
- C. All Class A and B Department Tournaments** will be played under the supervision of the Department Athletic Committee. All disputes and questions will be referred to the appropriate committee member whose decision shall be final.
- D. Eligibility Protests** - One week prior to the start of Class A Divisional play or Class B District play will be the deadline for filing all protests of player eligibility. Definite proof must be offered and the protest must be conducted as set up in the National Rules. No protest as to player eligibility will be allowed after this date. (Aim is to do away with protests after a tournament has started.) A \$25 deposit must accompany protest filed with the Department Athletic Committee. The protesting post must pay any court costs.
- J. Class B Playoff Tournaments** - All Class B Sectional and State Tournament games will be seven innings with the 10-run rule in effect after five innings.
1. **SECTIONAL TOURNAMENTS** - All teams in Class B competition will participate in Sectional Tournaments to be completed by August 6, 2007, inclusive, under the supervision of the Department Athletic Officer or his appointee. At least one week before the Sectional Tournament, the Department Athletic Officer in charge of the Section will call a meeting of Team Managers in the Section to make the drawings for the Sectional Tournament. The Sectional Tournament Manager will return all Form 1 to the teams upon their elimination from the Sectional Tournament. The forms of the winning team are given to the Department Athletic Officer. The winner of each Sectional Tournament will advance to the State Class B American Legion Baseball Tournament. The Department Sectional Representative will handle copies of Form 1 and birth certificates.

RULE 9 - Continued

- 1. STATE TOURNAMENT** - The American Legion eight-team double elimination Class B Tournament will be held August 8-12, 2007, with Bottineau as host. Teams participating will be the winner of each of the eight Class B Sectional Tournaments. The winner of this tournament will advance to the Central Plains B Regional Tournament at Beulah, ND, August 16-20. This tournament will be under the supervision of Ken Vatne of Hamlet. First round pairings for this year's 2007 tournament are:

Section 1 vs Section 6

Section 5 vs Section 8

Section 2 vs Section 3

Section 4 vs Section 7

- K. Class A Playoff Tournaments** - All Class A Divisional and State Tournament games will be nine innings with the 10-run rule in effect after seven innings.

- 2. DIVISIONAL TOURNAMENTS** - Class A Eastern and Western Divisional Tournaments will be held on August 2-4, 2007. A double-elimination format will be used. Regular season records within the Division will be used to seed the teams for post season play. In the event of a tie involving 2 or more teams, the first tie breaker will be head to head won-lost records among the teams that are tied. Should a tie still remain, the second tie-breaker will be runs allowed in games between the tied teams. Should a tie still remain, the third tie-breaker will be runs scored in games between the tied teams. Should a tie still remain the final tie-breaker will be a coin toss involving the teams that are tied. This coin toss will be handled by the Department Athletic Committeeman with jurisdiction over that tournament after proper notification to the teams involved. If a team does not complete the Divisional Conference schedule, it will be seeded in the final place for the Divisional Tournament.

A team that has been defeated in the loser-out round of the Divisional Tournament may request a challenge game for the number 4 Divisional seed at the state tournament if these criteria are met: They must have carried a higher seed into the tournament than the 4th Place team and they have not been defeated by that team in the earlier rounds of the tournament.

In those circumstances, a single challenge game will be played at the Divisional Tournament site on the next day after the placement round has been completed.

- a. The Eastern Divisional Tournament** will be in Fargo. Ron Frydenlund, 1227 2nd Ave. SW, Jamestown, ND 58401, is the Dept Rep. (Res-252-7163).
- b. The Western Divisional Tournament** will be in Bismarck. Jake Raile, 807 3rd Ave. NE, Mandan, ND, is the Dept Rep. (Res-663-1484) (Work-667-6601) (Cell-220-2272).

- 3. STATE TOURNAMENT** - The Class A American Legion double-elimination State Tournament will be held at Fargo on August 8-12, 2007. The ten run rule will be in effect for all tournament games. This tournament will be under the supervision of Department Athletic Committee Chairman Ken Vatne of Hamlet. The winner of this tournament will advance to the Central Plains A Regional Tournament at Marshall, MN, August 16-20, 2007.

RULE 9 – Continued

- L. Umpires** - All umpires are urged to attend an American Legion Umpire Baseball Instructional Clinic or a ND High School Activities Association Umpire Clinic that are scheduled in your area. Clinic attendance is **MANDATORY** for umpires desiring assignment to Sectional, Divisional and State Tournaments. The Department Athletic Committee from recommendations of the Department umpire-in-chief and teams involved wherever possible will select these umpires.
- a. **(Rule Change) At a minimum**, there shall be at least two competent umpires at all games in the Class B Sectional and Class A Divisional Tournaments except for Championship games **in Class B Sectionals**, where three umpires will be used. There shall be three competent umpires at all games in the Class A and B State Tournaments.
 - b. Umpires for Class A & B Sectional/Divisional and State Tournaments will receive a minimum of \$25.00 per game plus \$15.00 per deim (if traveling), \$.20 per mile and reimbursement of up to \$40.00 per night for hotel. **THIS IS AN OBLIGATION OF THE HOST POST.**
- M. Advance Tournament Fee** - Posts sponsoring Legion Baseball Tournaments are required to make payment of tournament fee, prior to holding tourney as follows: **Class A State \$150.00, Class B State \$150.00, Class B Sectional \$100.00, Class A Divisional \$100.00.** Check in the correct amount should be made payable to the N.D. American Legion and submitted to Department Headquarters, Box 2666, Fargo, ND 58108, prior to the tournament. Department representatives are responsible to collect these fees.
